



### Editorial Fellowship Applicant Eligibility

#### Eligibility Guidelines

The Family Process Institute (FPI) Editorial Fellowship reflects FPI's commitment to social justice and to amplifying diverse voices, particularly those historically underrepresented in editorial leadership within family therapy, family science, and family policy.

#### Purpose

The Fellowship is designed to prepare promising scholars for editorial leadership while contributing to a more culturally diverse publishing community.

#### Eligibility Requirements

#### Applicants must:

- Hold a tenure-track or tenured faculty position (all ranks eligible).
- Have a strong interest in the editorial process but limited prior editorial experience.
- Demonstrate knowledge in family and systems theory, practice, research, and policy.
- Show a strong commitment to social justice.
- Evidence exceptional communication, management, and relationship skills, as well as good judgment.
- Scholars from underrepresented backgrounds (e.g., Black, Indigenous, and People of Color) are especially encouraged to apply.

#### Fellowship Details

- Duration: One year
- Mentorship: The Fellow will work closely with Dr. Melanie Domenech Rodríguez, Editor of *Family Process*.
- Editorial Experience: The Fellow will manage up to 4 manuscripts under supervision, including selecting reviewers, making editorial decisions based on reviews, and following accepted manuscripts through publication (which may extend slightly beyond the fellowship period).
- Meetings: Regular virtual meetings with the Editor (with possible in-person meetings at conferences).
- Future Opportunities: Upon successful completion, the Fellow may be invited to join the *Family Process* editorial board.
